This year our organ tour takes to the road, for a driving tour in southeast Denver. Starting at Calvary Baptist Church, we'll hear the story of this old congregation and its newer building. Finally, our tour will end at Christ Church, originally a mission of St. John's on 14th and Washington. All sites have abundant parking.

Each of our three churches have prepared a short organ concert, as well as demonstrations of the various pipes and stops for each organ. The music will serenade and showcase the acoustics of each of the sites. Gather at 9 a.m. at Calvary Baptist Church to be ready for the tour to begin at 9:30 a.m.
