

From the Sea to the Stars Organist Faythe Freese in Concert

he show must go on! And last-minute technical problems with the organ at the original site for this program did not deter Faythe Freese from moving across town for her spectacular recital on Friday, March 21. Augustana Lutheran Church was a great venue with a fine organ and space for instruments, a large screen, and sound equipment. The program might be described as "out of this world," since the opening work, "Interstellar" by Hans Zimmer, was paired with visuals of stars, planets, and outer space. Equally unusual was Alesh Jermar's Revêtu de Lumière (Clad in Light) with recorded whale songs. "Peaceful Valley Medley" by Eurydice V. Osterman was illustrated with photographs of mountains and valleys by Ed Mack. What might this great artist—now a resident of Colorado and member of the Denver Rocky Mountain AGO chapter—be dreaming up next?

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Candidates for Chapter Election

Below is information about the candidates brought forward by the Nominating Committee. The Executive Board has voted in favor of bringing this list of names for the election to the membership of this AGO chapter.

Cathy Bruno Treasurer

Cathy earned her CAGO in January 2022 and her SPC in February 2019. She has sung in church choirs since grade school. She studied accounting as part of her MBA. She retired in 2013 from a career as a health care executive. With a goal to be

a church musician, she earned a BA in music in 2016 at the University of Maine (Orono, Maine) studying pipe organ with Dr. Kevin Birch. She served as music intern at St. Paul the Apostle



Catholic parish in Bangor, Maine, during her senior year where, in addition to service playing, she gained experience in choir training and program administration. Since moving to Denver in October 2016, Cathy has sung in choirs and substituted as organist and pianist at Catholic and Methodist churches. She currently sings with the choir at the Cathedral Basilica of the Immaculate Conception and substitutes as organist when the director is away. Cathy is an active board member serving as the Treasurer of the DRMC of the AGO since 2017 and co-treasurer of the AGO Denver 2019 convention. She also serves as Secretary of the St. John's Organ Society (Bangor, Maine), where she was instrumental in organizing conferences in 2010 and 2017.

Barbara Hulac Secretary

Barbara Hulac retired last year as the Associate Minister of Music and Organist at Montview Boulevard Presbyterian Church in Denver, Colorado. During her 40+ years of



music ministry at Montview, Barbara collaborated with countless musicians and ensembles. She served as rehearsal accompanist and administrator for Montview's Westminster Choir. A native of Pennsylvania, Barbara held her first church organist positions during her teenage years. She earned a bachelor's degree in Church Music with a Major in Organ Performance from Westminster Choir College where she studied with Dr. Donald

McDonald. Barbara has previously been organist at Our Savior's Lutheran Church and assistant organist at St. John's Cathedral, both in Denver.

Rhonda Jones Member at Large, class of 2028

Rhonda Jones is a Colorado native from the fourcorners area and moved to Aurora in 2021 when she joined the Denver Rocky Mountain AGO Chapter. She currently serves as organist at St.



Barnabas Episcopal Parish in Denver.

Rhonda has been a musician since childhood, when her parents often had to make her *stop* practicing the piano. Rhonda earned her BM degree from the University of Iowa. By chance, she was playing piano in a church when organ-builder Roy Redman installed a charming little 5-rank split-keyboard flat-pedal tracker. Rhonda has been playing organ ever since this encounter.

After college, Rhonda joined the conventional business workforce, and is therefore one of the AGO "weekend organists." She brings ideas from her experience as a substitute organist, and hopes to support this chapter's excellent communication and social networks.

Norman Sutphin Member at Large, class of 2028

Norman Sutphin is a native of central New Jersey. He has served as Organist at Trinity United Methodist Church since October, 2010, where he shares accompanying responsibilities of the Chancel Choir, has accompanied the Chancel Chamber Choir, and directed the Brass Ensemble. He has completed degrees from Lebanon Valley College in Annville, PA, and from Westminster Choir College in Princeton, NJ, where he studied organ with Pierce Getz and William Hays, respectively. Previous to his appointment at Trinity, he served as an organist and choir director

in churches in Asbury Park, NJ, Camden, AR, and Houston, TX. He has concertized and accompanied various soloists and ensembles in New Jersey, New Texas, York, Arkansas. and



Colorado. He is a Past-Dean of the American Guild of Organists and has served as a board member and Sub-Dean of the Denver Rocky Mountain Chapter. He is also a member of the Organ Historical Society.

Dr. Lindeen-Martin is active in the AGO, having served on the National Competitions Committee and as Director of the National Competition in Organ Improvisation (NCOI). She has enjoyed several terms as a teacher for the Denver Rocky Mountain AGO Scholarship Program. She has held the positions of Dean and Sub-dean for chapters in Iowa, Wisconsin, and Colorado and is currently on the board of the Denver Rocky Mountain Chapter. She is also on the Board of Directors for the International Keyboard Odyssiad © Festival (IKOF) founded and based in Fort Collins, CO where she serves as their Director of Competitions.

Lindeen-Martin is in demand as performer, lecturer, private instructor, and adjudicator. She

has performed in the U.S, Europe, and Mexico and is a frequent solo and collaborative performer in Colorado. One of Cindy's passions is introducing and teaching organ to new, aspiring youth and adult organists. She is also dedicated to building and maintaining thriving church music programs, cultivated throughout her career.

Cindy earned her Doctor of Musical Arts Degree and prestigious Performers Certificate from the Eastman School of Music, Rochester, NY and MM and BM degrees from Colorado State University, Fort Collins. Additional studies took her to France, earning the coveted Degré d'Excellence with Madame Marie-Claire Alain at the Conservatoire de Rueil-Malmaison, France. Dr. Lindeen-Martin is a recipient of the "Distinguished Alumnus Award in Music" from the Department of Music, Theatre and Dance of Colorado State University. Outside of music, Cindy enjoys reading, cooking and baking, entertaining, camping, hiking, traveling, and spending time with family.

Yinying Luo Member at Large, class of 2027

Yinying Luo is the Organist and Associate Minister of Music at Montview Boulevard Presbyterian Church. After growing up in China, Yinying enrolled in Agnes



Scott College, a Presbyterian College in Georgia, not intending to pursue a career in music. Discovering a love for the organ, she completed a Bachelor of Arts degree in music. She then won scholarships for continued study at the Juilliard School in New York City, where she earned a master's degree in organ performance. After a year's service as organist at the First Presbyterian Church in Santa Barbara, California, Yinying completed a master's in church music at Baylor University. She applied for the position at Montview while pursuing the highest level of organ studies at the Hochschule für Musik in

Detmold, Germany. She has given organ recitals in China, California, Georgia, New York, and Germany.

Zackary Gonzales Member at Large, class of 2026

Zackary Gonzales has been a young member of the AGO since 2021, when he received the Student Scholarship for that year. He apprenticed under Phil Bordeleau for the summer and



has since pursued organ independently. Outside of the AGO, Zack is an engineering student at Colorado School of Mines, studying Audio Engineering. He performs in his school's philharmonic orchestra as a percussionist, pianist, and organist and handles the audio/visual technologies for his school's auditorium. Despite his pursuit of engineering, Zack wishes to stay in the organ world and help teach young people about the instrument and bring more attention to the AGO.


