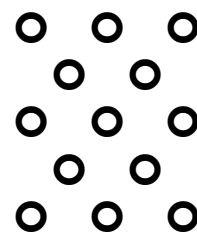

Nagem is Minister of Music at The Brick Presbyterian Church in New York City, and a member of the organ faculty at Manhattan School of Music. He completed his D.M.A. at The Juilliard School in 2016, where he was a student of Paul Jacobs. He earned his B.S. from Yale University in 2009, and his M.A. in 2011 from Juilliard. Prior to his appointment at Brick Church, he served for eleven years at the Cathedral of St. John the Divine in New York

City, where he was Associate Director of Music and Organist. Nagem has been touring this complete works of Duruflé concert this winter and spring. Tickets \$20, students \$10.

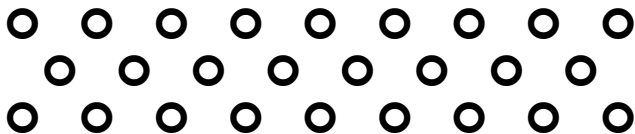
