

Update: 2022 Summer Organ Lesson Scholarship Program

I am pleased to report that the 2022 Summer Organ Lesson Scholarship Auditions were held on Saturday, 21 May 2022, as planned, at the home music studio of Linda Mack, who, along with Billie Busby and Cheryl Saborsky, served as judges for six applicants. Two additional applicants who were unable to be present on that date were auditioned later in the week by Linda Mack and Tom Strickland. All applicants performed remarkably well, and <u>the judges</u> <u>unanimously recommended that all eight</u> <u>applicants be awarded scholarships</u> for summer organ study.

The next activity related to the scholarship program will be an Orientation Session on Saturday, 4 June 2022, from 10:00-11:30 a.m. at Saint Paul Lutheran Church, 1600 Grant Street, in downtown Denver, for all scholarship recipients, their family members, prospective scholarship applicants, and interested members of the Denver Rocky Mountain Chapter. The Orientation Session will include a brief history of the organ as well as an introduction to organ construction and design, the organ console, organ registration, and playing technique. Scholarship winners will also be given the opportunity to hear various registrations and to play their required Bach 2-part invention audition piece on the organ. Do consider joining us for this informative session and bring along any or your piano students who might have an interest in participating in the scholarship program in the future. We do ask that all those in attendance wear masks given the recent increase in Covid transmission.


